

Bone Creek Sport & Gun Club Orientation

The goal of orientation is to acclimate all current and new members on club operations. The rules must be followed at all times. Any instruction or rule (written, posted at the site, or spoken by the orientation officer) that is not understood should be brought to the orientation officer's attention immediately for further explanation. Violation of ANY rules may result in disciplinary action by the gun club, including revocation of membership without refund.

1. All members need to sign in when using the ranges. Sheet is by the pistol range in the information shed.
2. Badges need to be worn at all times when using the ranges, so that other members will know if someone is trespassing on the ranges. This also helps new members in learning other members.
3. When using the ranges, if you move it or get it out, then put it back. This applies to tables, cardboard, chairs, and any other items used by the club. Tables on the pistol range belong under the cover, out of the weather, and not in the way of the shooting stations. Set chairs back when done. Throw away used targets and police the area for trash and brass. Brass may be placed in the black brass buckets on the range. DO NOT throw unfired rounds into the burn barrels. DO NOT shoot at any form of glass targets. Any non-glass targets must be collected and thrown away after shooting. The better the appearance, the more guests will appreciate the club, and possibly become members.
4. Do not bring loaded guns to the range during an event (CCH). If you do so, please use the "Safe Handling" area to unload them prior to entering the range area. During events the ranges are operated "cold" with no loaded firearms. All guns will be unloaded until instructed by the range officer to load. At all matches, involving pistol, the only approved holsters are strong side. No cross- draw, S.O.B., or shoulder holsters.
5. When leaving the line, make sure your weapon is unloaded. Be aware of other shooters.
6. Make sure that when there are others there, someone calls the line "hot" and all are aware of it.
7. Also make sure when going "clear" or "man down range" and all hear it. Never step forward of other shooters until the line is "clear". If you see unsafe actions do not hesitate to call a "cease fire", and bring it to the shooters attention.
8. 'General safety rules are posted on all ranges and on the back of your badge. It is your duty to follow them.
9. The steel plates are for pistol and .22 rifles ONLY! Pistols .44 cal with 12" barrel, and under only. High power rifle damages steel plates. If you notice that your shooting is damaging any target holders, steel plates, or anything else, STOP! The silhouette berms on the rifle range are-for .22 only. Centerfire rifles tear the berms apart, causing increased maintenance.
10. Your targets are to be placed so that rounds impact the bottom of the berms to minimize the chance of a round leaving the property.
11. The gates to the rifle range are not to be bypassed, Get in the habit of entering the rifle range thru the prescribed entrance. This is for your safety. You may not know if someone is shooting.
12. Set the range flag out when using the pistol or rifle range. The red flag means someone is shooting, and the blue flag means the range is temporarily closed, for work, or event, camping or fishing.
13. No alcohol on the ranges or empty alcohol cans on the range.
14. If you find something at the range, list it, with a brief description- and your phone number, on the sign-up sheet. Take the item home and notify a club officer. This will allow the member who lost it to contact you, and identify it.
15. No one is to be on any other property without express written consent. The surrounding properties are not controlled by the club, and are off limits. Club members may fish the pond, located off of the rifle range, using "catch & release" methods.
16. There is to be no hunting of any kind at the range property.
17. Gate and lock are to be closed and secured at all times (except during public events).
18. Report the license plate number of any violators to Bob Peters (bpeters12@cox.net).
